Lion Greg Sheldon runs Albany Victory Gardens, where volunteers gather to share gardening knowledge

and grow food, activities that bridge social, economic, and diversity gaps prevalent in the community. It's a place that feeds the souls of the gardeners – nearby residents – as it builds self-reliance, provides food to low-income residents, and enhances the urban environment.

Gardens was being cleared of abandoned houses, he was determined to see the once-vacant urban lot up-cycled into an agricultural oasis benefitting his community. Through a partnership between Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and Anthem Foundation, committed to improving public health, local Lions used sweat equity to bring a blueberry orchard to life.

Equally as important as yielding nutrient-dense fruit, the 200 bushes Lions planted attract pollinators, improve air quality, and increase agricultural yield. Said Sheldon, “Our orchard puts food on tables as it improves the environment and feeds the community’s soul. LCIF and Anthem support gives new meaning to the term ‘seed money!’”
